- 1. Le 15 octobre 2012, le Conseil a adopté la décision 2012/642/PESC concernant des mesures restrictives à l'encontre de la Biélorussie. Le 18 mai 2006, il avait adopté le règlement (CE) n° 765/2006 concernant des mesures restrictives à l'encontre de la Biélorussie. Ces actes ont par la suite été mis en œuvre et modifiés à plusieurs reprises.
- 2. Le 26 septembre 2013, le groupe des conseillers pour les relations extérieures a examiné de nouveaux exposés des motifs pour des personnes et une entité, dont la liste figure à l'annexe II de la présente note, et est parvenu à un accord sur leur texte. Le groupe a aussi arrêté un projet de lettre standard (voir annexe I) informant les personnes et l'entité énumérés à l'annexe II de l'intention du Conseil de modifier les motifs de leur inscription sur la liste. Par ailleurs, le groupe a arrêté les projets de lettres spécifiques à adresser à certaines personnes et à une entité (voir annexe III).

Draft response to Mr. Yury Chyzh

The Council has considered the observations in your letter dated 2 September 2013, but it remains

of the view that the restrictive measures against you should be maintained. The Council intends to

modify the statement of reasons as indicated in its previous letter.

Furthermore, the Council intends to add in the statement of reasons the fact that in June 2013, you

were awarded by President Lukashenka the highest state distinction for your services. The intended

statement of reasons would therefore read as follows:

"Iury Chyzh is associated with President Lukashenka and his sons and benefits from and supports

the Lukashenka regime, especially through his holding company LLC Triple. The activities of LLC

Triple include activities resulting from public awards and concessions from the regime. In June

2013 he was awarded by President Lukashenka the highest state distinction for his services. The

sporting positions which Iury Chyzh retains, notably his membership of the Central Council of the

President's Sports Club and being Chair of the Board of the football club FC Dynamo Minsk and

Chair of the Belarusian Federation of wrestling, confirm his association to the regime."

Draft response to Mr. Peftiev

The Council refers to your letters of 7 September 2012 and 10 June 2013 requesting reconsideration of your designation in the framework of the restrictive measures adopted by the European Union against Belarus.

The Council has already explained in its previous letters the reasons why it considered that your designation should be maintained. The essence of those reasons is that you are associated with President Lukashenka and members of his family, including through financial support and economic advice.

Furthermore, an additional listing criterion was introduced by Council Decision 2012/36/CFSP of 23 January 2012 covering "persons or entities benefiting from or supporting the Lukashenka regime" (see also recital 4 of that decision), also reflected in Council Regulation 114/2012 (second recital and Article 1). Since then, being "a key financial sponsor of the Lukashenka regime" also constitutes a separate ground for designation under this new criterion.

Moreover, Decision 2012/642/CFSP of 15 October 2012 extended the restrictive measures against Belarus for a further year and consolidated them into a single Decision. It also consolidated the criteria for designating persons and entities. In particular, the asset freeze in Article 4 of this Decision applies to "(a) persons, entities or bodies responsible for serious violations of human rights or the repression of civil society and democratic opposition, or whose activities otherwise seriously undermine democracy or the rule of law in Belarus, or any natural or legal persons, entities or bodies associated with them, as well as legal persons, entities or bodies owned or controlled by them;" and "(b) natural or legal persons, entities or bodies benefiting from or supporting the Lukashenka regime, as well as legal persons, entities or bodies owned or controlled by them" as listed in the Annex to the Decision. In addition, pursuant to Article 3 of this Decision, the travel restrictions apply to persons falling within these criteria and listed in the Annex.

Consequently, Article 2 of Regulation 765/2006 as amended by Council Regulation (EU)

No 1014/2012 of 6 November 2012 also applies to these two categories of persons and entities.

Recital 6 of Decision 2012/642/CFSP explains that "given the gravity of the situation, measures should also be imposed on persons in a leading position in Belarus, and on persons and entities benefiting from or supporting the Lukashenka regime, in particular persons and entities providing financial or material support to the regime".

The premise that major businessmen in Belarus generally have close relations with that country's leaders is *inter alia* illustrated by a study commissioned by the European Parliament, by commentators² and a former Russian economy minister.³

In the Annex to Decision 2012/642/CFSP and to Regulation 765/2006 as amended by Regulation 1014/2012 and implemented by Implementing Regulation 1017/2012, the reason given for your designation are "Person associated with President Lukashenka, Viktar Lukashenka and Dzmitry Lukashenka. Provides economic advice to President Lukashenka and is a key financial sponsor of the Lukashenka regime through his business interests which include Sport Pari, BT Telecommunications and the Spirit and Vodka Company Aquadiv" (point A.154 of the Annex).

The Council intends to amend these reasons in order to reflect the delisting of the Spirit and Vodka Company Aquadiv and of Sport Pari (resulting from a change in ownership).

The Council has assessed the observations which you presented in your most recent letters and considers that they do not justify lifting the EU's restrictive measures against you. The Council therefore remains of the view that the restrictive measures against you are justified.

Evgenii Yasin, quoted in *id*. as having said that: "Belarus you have one oligarch – Lukashenka. And he runs everything. Well, some people ["oligarchs"] emerge to whom he can give an order: hear, invest there and there. That is it!".

In particular, the Council still considers that you are associated with family members of President Lukashenka and are benefiting from and supporting the Lukashenka regime. More specifically:

- You support the regime, in particular financially through your business interests, which include BT Telecommunications.
- You also benefit from the regime through your large scale business activities in Belarus which would not be possible without the approval of the Lukashenka regime.
- You provided economic advice to President Lukashenka.
- You have close ties to family members of President Lukashenka.¹

The Council therefore intends to modify the reasons for your designation as follows: "Person associated with President Lukashenka, Viktar Lukashenka and Dzmitry Lukashenka. Benefits from and supports the Lukashenka regime. Provides economic advice to President Lukashenka and is a key financial sponsor of the Lukashenka regime through his business interests which include BT Telecommunications."

In your application before the court, you have admitted having had contacts with President Lukashenka and his sons Viktor and Dmitry, including in the framework of Sport-Pari and the

President's Sports Club.

<u>Draft notification letter to Beltekh Holding</u>

Beltekh Holding is currently subject to the restrictive measures adopted by the European Union against Belarus as an "*Entity controlled by Vladimir Peftiyev*" (see point B.9 of the Annex to Council Decision 2012/642/CFSP and to Regulation 765/2006 as amended by Regulation 1014/2012 and implemented by Implementing Regulation 1017/2012).

Following an apparent change in ownership of Beltekh Holding (namely Mr. Peftiev having sold his shares in it), the Council intends to continue to designate Beltekh Holding under the restrictive measures against Belarus but on different grounds.

In particular, the Council intends to designate Beltekh Holding on the basis that it benefits from and supports the Lukashenka regime, in particular through Beltechexport, which is part of Beltekh Holding. Beltechexport is designated under the restrictive measures against Belarus for the following reasons: "Entity formerly owned by Vladimir Peftiyev. Its majority shareholder is Dmitry Gurinovich, Mr Peftiyev's former advisor in Velcom. Beltechexport benefits from the regime as the main exporter of arms and military equipment owned by the state or produced by state-owned companies. It supports and provides revenue to the Lukashenka regime by its sale of arms" (see point B.1 of the Annex to Council Decision 2012/642/CFSP and to Regulation 765/2006 as amended by Regulation 1014/2012 and implemented by Implementing Regulation 1017/2012).

Therefore the Council intends to modify the reasons for Beltekh Holding's designation to read as follows: "Entity formerly owned by Vladimir Peftiyev. Its majority shareholder is Dmitry Gurinovich, Mr Peftiyev's former advisor in Velcom. Benefits from and supports the Lukashenka regime, in particular through Beltechexport, which is part of Beltekh Holding. Beltechexport benefits from the regime as the main exporter of arms and military equipment owned by the state or produced by state-owned companies. It supports and provides revenue to the Lukashenka regime by its sale of arms".
